Visit to OLSG Church

On Friday 18th October we will be visiting Our Lady of Mount Carmel and St. George (the parish church of 13th Enfield part of our colony). We will having a tour of the church, a little activity sheet to complete and a discussion on good and bad. (this goes towards elements of our Faith badge).
